





Why is FEEVA important to BEVA



- Direct lobbying to EU
 - Important especially in the event of a 'soft Brexit'
 - Medicines
 - Availability, pan-Europe licencing
 - Phenylbutazone, food animal production
 - Disease
 - Shared surveillance and monitoring
 - Animal movement
- Opportunities




What does Brexit mean for Veterinary workforce

New registrations by country of qualification






What does Brexit mean for Veterinary Medicine



- Free movement: 2005/36
 - Allows EU veterinary surgeons to register to work in the UK





Current EU nationals working in the UK



- Post-Brexit CURRENT M'sRCVS
 - No mechanism for membership to be revoked
 - Non payment of fees
 - Professional misconduct

- Visa issues
 - Status of EU nationals CURRENTLY working in UK likely to be an important negotiation point (reciprocity)



Mutual Recognition of Veterinary Degrees



- Mutual recognition by RCVS
 - School by School
 - Country by Country
 - EAEVE accreditation
- Failing that
 - Statutory membership exam
- English Language Requirements
 - Currently only imposed on EU nationals where 'concerns' exist
 - IELTS 7.0



Visiting services



- 2005/36/EC
 - Provision of temporary services
 - Pre-purchase examinations
 - Currently a simple TWO WAY process
 - POST BREXIT
 - Recognition of veterinary degrees
 - Rights to work in each country



What does Brexit mean for health and medicines



- Movement of animals
 - Tripartite agreement
 - Not EU legislation BUT relies upon EU legislation
- Legislation
 - Animal Welfare Act
 - Passports and central equine database
 - Medicines Regulations
 - Currently VMD are engaging in EU medicines regulations
 - Important for trade

Our own opportunity for BREXIT



- BEVA is a 'division' of the British Veterinary Association
 - 15000 members (out of 25,000 M'sRCVS)
 - The 'Voice of the Profession' 60percent?
 - Only 25percent of veterinary graduates
 - Provides Journals, member benefits, CPD representation

VETFUTURES

- The profession in 2030
 - Not what the profession needed to represent in 2030
 - Lobbying NOT valued by members



An alternative



- An international (European) voice
- Equine Veterinary Profession
 - Provides services
 - Lobbying
 - Education
 - IT; web
 - Buying power
 - Enable the equine profession to embrace change
 - Addresses international challenges
 - Subsidised by member associations
 - VALUED by membership
